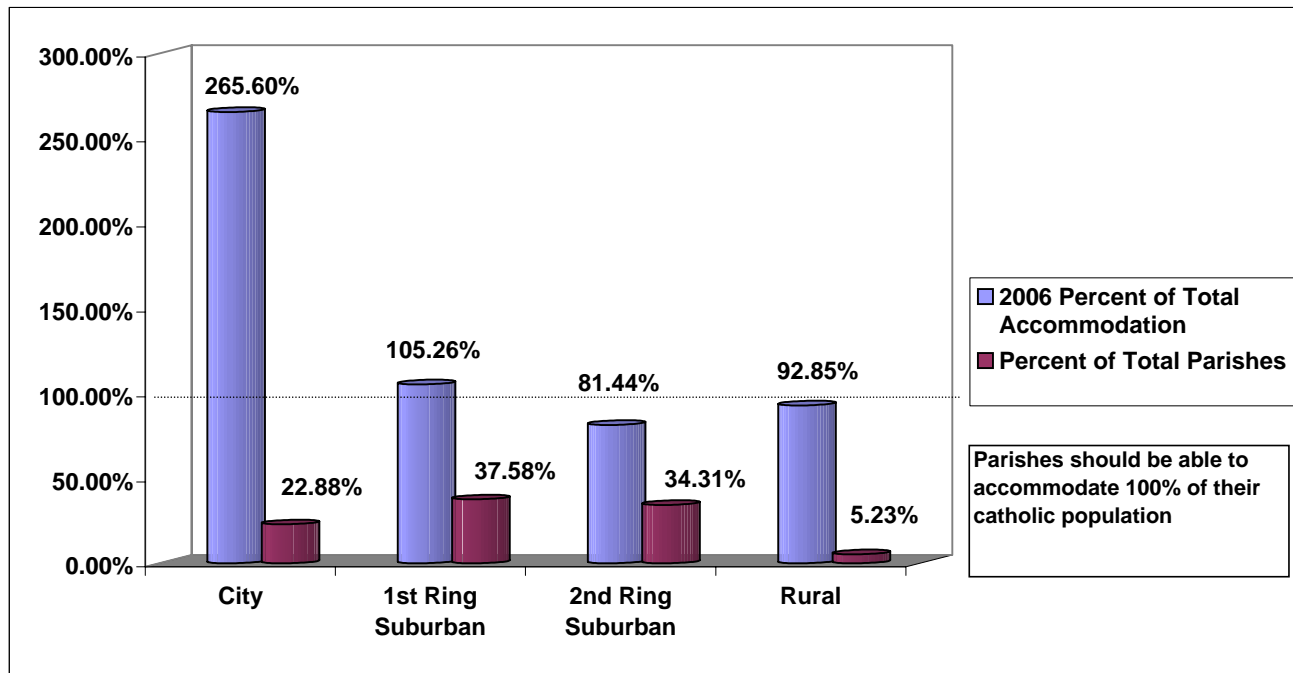


ARCHDIOCESE OF DETROIT PERCENT OF TOTAL ACCOMMODATION BY LOCATION

Total Accommodation = Church seating multiplied by number of weekend liturgies

% of Accommodation = Total Accommodation divided by 2006 CSA Reg Individuals multiplied by 100

Note: This cylinder graph shows that in the city the Catholic churches can accommodate seating for 265 percent of its Catholic population, that is, the city churches have 165% more seating capacity than what is needed. In the second ring suburban churches, where most of the Catholic population resides, the Catholic churches can only accommodate seating for 81 percent of the Catholic population, that is, the second ring suburban churches cannot provide seating for approximately 20 percent of its Catholic population. Therefore, city parishes need to assess the number of Masses being offered (decreasing that number) and at what parish sites. Second ring suburban parishes need to assess whether to provide more Masses, increase their seating capacities, or build more parishes.
