**Our brother and fellow priest, Father Lawrence E. Dunn, entered eternal life on Thursday, March 13, at the age of 72.**

**Father Dunn was born on May 3, 1935 in Detroit and ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Detroit on June 3, 1961. His many assignments included serving as temporary administrator at St. Alexander, Farmington Hills; administrator at Our Lady of Guadalupe Mission, Port Huron; associate pastor at St. Clement of Rome, Romeo; St. Isaac Jogues, St. Clair Shores; and Most Holy Trinity, Detroit; and pastor at St. Roch, Flat Rock; Sacred Heart, Yale; Sacred Heart Mission, Brown City; and St. Mary Burnside, North Branch. Father Dunn also served as Chaplain at the Yale Community Health Center; and assisted at Our Lady of Lourdes, the archdiocesan mission parish in Recife, Brazil.
